## Journey through time

I settled on the styles for BOBbyDOP quite quickly. I think there's a good mix of party and day and they're all classic and easy to wear. I just wanted to pick shapes that people would associate with different decades. I'm drawn to the '60s personally and I think the collection will always have a strong '60s vibe, but I'll definitely mix it up with the '50s, '70s and '80s.

### **Literary inspiration**

The geese and the Fabs and Wotsits prints on my BOBbyDOP skirts are inspired by my two books – Goose, and Paper Aeroplanes, which is about two '90s schoolgirls. The book quotes were inspired by some of my favourite quotes from my favourite books. I just love the idea of a girl sitting in a bar waiting for her date and reading her skirt. The dog walkers were just because I'm so batty about animals, so I wanted lots of different kinds of women walking different dogs.

### **Power dressing**

All of my designs are created with the intention that you can eat a good meal and then go dancing. Two of the styles – the 'Elvin' and the 'Charlie' - have subtle shoulder pads, but they just give you

that statuesque feeling where you feel up and proud. They've all been given little touches that will make you feel like the most important person in the room.

# Beginner's vintage

The high street seems huge, but actually you're limited by what's in fashion. The great thing about vintage is that you're completely unlimited. You've got decades to choose from, so have a look
